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## Sport Premium Proposals

2018/2019

### Kexborough Primary School

At Kexborough Primary School we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in every pupil's education, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better.

Kexborough Primary School acknowledges the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of its children. We also recognise that a broad, balanced, high quality curriculum and extra-curricular activities have a positive impact on concentration, attitude and achievement. The Sport Premium funding is allowing us to develop a sustainable improvement in teacher confidence. Regular staff training opportunities are provided for teachers and teaching assistants (TAs) to keep them abreast of new initiatives.

### Sport Premium Grant

Funding for schools will be calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) as at the annual census in January 2017. All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil. Smaller schools will receive £500 per pupil.

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### What does the Sport Premium mean for my School?
